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GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Gates fees are payable fair day as follows:
Adults \$5.00
Children (6-14 yrs) \$2.00
Preschool free
2. **Any person 16 years and older, wishing to exhibit must pay a \$3 annual membership fee.** This fee must accompany the entries, plus any entry fee in classes and sections where specified.
3. Children will not be charged an entry fee to enter Classes 8, 12 & 13.
4. Make hall entries to **Box 2118, Tisdale, SK S0E 1T0 or email wallingmd@gmail.com** or call **1-306-873-2217**. Make your entries early to ensure you receive your tags before fair morning so you can tag exhibits prior to arriving.
5. All animals and articles must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor at least 30 days prior to the fair. Products of the soil must be grown during the current crop year.
6. No exhibit will necessarily be awarded a prize unless deemed worthy by the judges.
7. No prize will be given for any exhibit other than those listed in the Prize List.
8. No exhibit will be accepted without an entry tag.
9. Only one exhibit will be allowed to an exhibitor in any one section, with the exception of livestock.
10. Judges will be appointed by the directors in charge and no person may act as a judge in a department where he or she is an exhibitor.
11. All exhibits must be in place by 9 a.m. the day of the fair. Judging starts 9:30 a.m.
12. Special prizes awarded on a total of points will count: 1st and Specials, 3 points; 2nd, 2 points, 3rd, 1 point, 4th, 1/2 point. In case of a tie for total point prizes, the prize will be awarded to the exhibitor winning the most 1st prizes. Should a tie still remain, the distribution of prizes will be left to the discretion of the directors of that class.
13. Neither the Agricultural Society nor any of its officials shall be responsible for the loss or injury from whatsoever cause to exhibits, persons or property, although care will be taken to prevent such loss or injury. Neither are they responsible for typographical errors that may appear in the Prize List.
14. The Society reserves the right to pay a percentage of the prize money if circumstances beyond their control prevent a payment in full.
15. All merchandise prizes must be used before date stated on certificate.
16. Entry tags must be placed on exhibits before exhibits are placed on display.

17. Protests affecting awards must be made in writing to the secretary before 6 p.m. on fair day, accompanied by \$10 which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained by a majority of the directors in meeting.
18. No hall prize money shall be paid out on fair day. Exhibitors must send claim sheet to Treasurer for payment of hall prize money.
19. Exhibit classes as collections are judged as collections and must be kept together, i.e. in an open box or attached to a common background to avoid separation.
20. CLEAN-UP DAYS - will be posted on the website, once determined.
21. The Society reserves the right to withhold prize money if exhibits are removed from the fairgrounds before the specified times. Hall Exhibits - 6 p.m.
22. Please take note of any special rules applying to specific classes.
23. *CAMPING OVERNIGHT?* Please come prepared! Some power hook-ups, no running water and no food booths open until fair day. Just a nice bush to camp beside. Coffee, drinking water, and water for livestock will be available on fair day. Pancake Breakfast on fair day morning: sausages, pancakes and coffee or juice for \$5.



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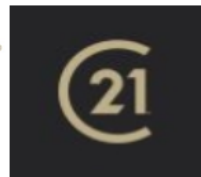
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HORSE SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The Golburn Fair Horse Show will be conducted under the current rules of the Equine Canada (EC) and is sanctioned by the Saskatchewan Horse Federation (SHF). The show committee reserves the right to make decisions on matters not specified in this prize list.
2. **DATE:** Saturday, August 9th, 2025. Horse show will start at 8:30 am, sharp. Registration booth will be open by 8:00 a.m.
3. **DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES:** Entries and fees paid in full must be received no later than one week before Fair Day. Entry and membership fees are non-refundable.
 - *An entry form and liability waiver has been included in the centre of the booklet. Please photocopy or attach an additional page if you require more space. We require a separate entry form and waiver for each exhibitor; however, those who are showing more than one horse may enter all their horses on the same form.
 - * Late and ringside entries will be double the fee with the exception of lead line, spectator western pleasure and our optional surprise class. All ringside entries must fill out an entry form & waiver.
 - * Ringside entries **will not** be accepted for any of the jackpot classes.
 - * Unless otherwise stated in the program, the entry fee is \$3.00 per event.
 - * There is an administration fee of \$5.00 per rider.
 - * Exhibitors 16 years and older are required to pay the \$3.00 Golburn Agricultural Society membership fee, but membership is open to anyone who would like to support the fair in this way.
4. **ADDRESS FOR ENTRIES:** Drop off or mail your entry and fees to GOLBURN HORSE SHOW - Box 114, Sylvania, SK., S0E 1S0. For horse entry information contact Karen at 306-873-8458 or painteds-farm@gmail.com.
5. **GATE ADMISSION:** All exhibitors are required to pay the general admission fees at the gate on fair morning: \$5 for adults, \$2 for children, preschoolers are free. We will be counting on your co-operation in this matter if you arrive the evening before the fair.
6. **MANDATORY HELMET RULE:** Participants 18 years of age and under will not be allowed into the ring for any class unless they are wearing an approved helmet (bicycle helmets do not meet the required standard). Ages are as of January 1st of the current year.
7. **PRIZE PAYOUT:**
 - * Regular classes - First - \$12; Second - \$10; Third - \$8; Fourth - \$6; Fifth - \$4
 - * Jackpot classes - any sponsorship obtained for the jackpot events will be added to the entry fee pot, which 90% of the pot will be paid out - 40%, 30%, 20% and 10%.

8. SPECIAL SPONSORED PRIZES:

* Class 1: First and second place exhibitors in each division (except pee wee) of the halter and western pleasure classes are eligible to compete in the championship class for the respective event. There are no entry fees for the championship classes. Grand and reserve championship prizes will be awarded.

* Class 2: Gymkhana Best Combined Times. The best combined times of each of the age divisions, calculated on a horse & rider combination, will receive a prize. The classes to be used to calculate this award will be Barrel Racing, Pole Bending and Stake Race.

* Aggregate Hi-Point - The rider and horse combination who receives the most points throughout the entire fair day will be awarded the Aggregate Hi-Point Award. Points are awarded for each class and totalled at the end of fair day.

* Pot of Gold. One class/age division throughout the day will be chosen at random to be the Pot of Gold class. The winner of this class will receive double the prize payout.

** We are fortunate to have several classes that are sponsored by individual and local businesses. Please take the time to thank them for their support.*

9. AGE DIVISIONS: (age as of January 1 of the current year)

Senior	18 years and over
Junior A	15 - 17 years
Junior B	12 - 14 years
Junior C	11 years and under
Pee Wee	8 years and under

10. HORSE/RIDER/EVENT:

* Exhibitors will be given a number for each horse, when they register, which must be pinned in clear view on each side of the saddle blanket.

* Exhibitors may compete in only one age division of an event. With the exception of Pee Wee aged exhibitors, who may enter in either the Pee Wee class or the Junior C division, but not both age divisions of the same event.

* A horse may be shown or ridden by only one exhibitor in each event. With the exception of Pee Wee exhibitors, who may share a horse with another exhibitor in up to 3 classes.

* A horse used in one age division of an event cannot be used in another age division, with the exception of lead line, pee wee and spectator western pleasure classes.

* Exhibitors may enter up to 2 horses in halter classes (1-5), timed gymkhana classes and the jackpot open trail class. Both horses must be saddled.

* If an improper entry is made regarding the height of a horse or the age of an exhibitor, they will be entered in the proper section, unless that section has been previously judged.

11. **PROGRAM ORDER:**

* Our Show begins at 8:30 am in the order listed under Class 1. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or split divisions of events based on the number of entries. Any changes to the Class 1 schedule will be posted by 7:30 the morning of the show and by noon for Class 2. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or split divisions of events based on the number of entries.

* Gymkhana will follow the completion of Class 1 events and may not run in the exact order as listed under Class 2. * **ONE-MINUTE WARNING FOR ALL CLASSES** - Please be ready to enter the ring when the class or your number is called. The ring gate will be closed one minute after the final call.

12. **PROTESTS & DISPUTES:** These will be reviewed by a committee of two horse show directors and an executive member of the Golburn Agricultural Society. Please submit your protest in writing along with a \$50 deposit to the sound booth. The deposit will be refunded if the committee rules in your favour.

13. **MISCONDUCT/ABUSE:** Exhibitors will be disqualified or requested to leave the grounds for abusing their horses in any manner, or for misconduct on the part of either the exhibitor or horse in the ring or anywhere on the fairgrounds. The judge's decision is final regarding situations in the ring, while the show committee will rule on incidents that arise elsewhere.

14. **SAFETY:**

* **All participants 18 years and younger, as of January 1 of the current year must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet.**

* Horses must be confined to the ring, stall and trailer areas and cannot be led or ridden to other parts of the fairgrounds or parking lot.

* Make way for exhibitors entering and exiting the ring. Parents and adults must ensure that children, whether they are spectators or exhibitors, stay clear of the ride-out area at all times.

* For minor incidents, a first aid kit is available at the sound booth.

* Please report all accidents that occur on the grounds during fair day to the sound booth so that the required documentation can be filed with the SHF.

15. **FACILITIES:**

* If you will be tying to your trailer in the parking lot, please pick up all manure. There will be a wheelbarrow at the gate if you need one. We have to make sure that there is no manure left in the parking lot.

PLEASE KEEP YOUR HORSE AWAY FROM THE BINS AND OUT OF THE CROPS. Thank you very much for your co-operation in this matter.

* Camping in the parking lot is permitted, so please set up in an orderly manner if you don't want to have to move on fair morning! Parking is usually very tight on fair day. *Horse trailers must be parked facing east & west in rows from north to south.*

* There is no running water or power for campers. Water for the horses will be available in the horse area and drinking water will be in the tank at the east side of the concession. The concession booth will open with a pancake breakfast at 7 a.m. the morning of the fair. Hot dogs, burgers, cold plates, homemade pies, treats, cold drinks and coffee will be sold on fair day.

7. Use the sheet in the judge's book to tabulate points for class specials. This is important so that awards can be handed out.

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CLASS 4 - FLOWERS & PLANTS

TIPS ON EXHIBITING FLOWERS

Size in individual bloom is desirable, but quality and form should not be passed up to secure size. Too frequently splendid specimens fail to place because of water-marks, insect damage, disease or sunburn.

Gladioli - Should be cut at least 15" from the bottom flower base of stem. One third of the spike should be in bloom, one third should be showing colour, and one third should be tight. Take care the spike is straight.

Dahlias - Blooms should be fresh and free from wilting of outer petals. Centers full in all but singles. Be sure to measure the blooms.

Roses - May not be shown in rose bowls or equivalent. Must be shown with stem. Should be 1/4 to 3/4 open.

Sweet Peas - Length and straightness of stem, size and texture of florets and the number open.

Pansies, Petunias, and Begonias - Larger size, texture and quality of bloom. Must be shown with stem inserted through holes.

Marigolds - Over 3" and Zinnias - Should be on long stem, head well above the top of container. Should have each flower head so it can easily seen. Some leaves should be showing above the top of the container. Be sure to measure blooms.

Arrangements - In making up bouquets it is the artistic choice of colours and types that blend harmoniously and which lend themselves to the type of arrangement done by using only a small number of blooms. Do not add decorations or fillers such as fern or baby's breath unless specified.

CLASS 5 - VEGETABLES & FRUITS

Entry Fee: .50 cents/entry

TIPS ON EXHIBITING VEGETABLES

Beets - Medium sized roots deep red colour throughout. They should be free from white rings. Uniformity in the group is important. Tops should be removed 1/2" above the crown.

Cabbage - Heads should be solid, free from insect damage and cracks, and not stripped.

Carrots - Should be uniform, clean, free from sunburn, discolouration and side roots. Tops should be removed 1/2" above the crown.

Cauliflower - Leaves should be cut off level with the top of the head. The curd should be white and compact. Remove small leaves between florets.

Celery - Leave on all the top leaves. Trim the roots to a point.

Chard - Shown in a bunch, cut at base.

Cucumbers - Should be uniform, of good green colour. They should be clean and without the withered blossom; with the stem left on.

Onions - Medium sized with mature bulbs. Thick necks seldom with prize. Roots and tops should be trimmed down to 1/2" but not peeled. To mature onions, hollow out the stem a few days before showing.

Peas and Beans - Should be shown with stems on.

Potatoes - Extra large potatoes frequently have hollow hearts. Medium - sized, uniform tubers free from disease and insect damage and with shallow eyes are more to be desired.

Radishes - tops and roots must be removed 1/2" above the crown.

Rhubarb - Stalks uniform, the leaf blade should be trimmed to leave about one inch in a fan shape. The stalks should be left intact as pulled from plant except any loose tissue at base should be trimmed away.

Tomatoes - Tomatoes should be shown with stems on. Uniformity is important. (Colour and shape).

Turnips - Trim off side roots and tops to 1/2" crown.

Zucchini - Should be about 12" or under.

Judging

Vegetables are judged from standpoint of table use. Medium sized generally indicates superior quality to larger size. Dirt on vegetables will also disqualify the exhibit. It is permissible to wash vegetables, but care must be taken not to bruise or damage the skin in any manner.

Notes:

1. Names of vegetable varieties must be placed on the entry tags, also NAMES of fruit varieties. Name to be placed at the TOP of the entry tag where it can be seen.

2. All vegetables and fruits including those in collection must have the variety NAMED on the entry tag, otherwise entry will be disqualified.
3. All vegetables must be clean.
4. All hall exhibits must be in place by 9 a.m. the day of the Fair. Judging to start at 9:30 a.m. Exhibits must not be removed before 6:00 p.m.
5. All vegetables judged accordingly to judging standards outlined in the booklet

* Judging Standards for Horticultural Exhibits”.
